## Adelaide Uni Meat Judges Bring Home the Bacon

During the first week of the holidays the Adelaide University Meat Judging Team travelled to Wagga Wagga, NSW for the exciting four day Intercollegiate Meat Judging (ICMJ) industry workshop and competition. This year was the 27<sup>th</sup> annual event, held from the 5<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> July, and attracted the largest cohort yet of 130 student entries.

This year's Adelaide team comprised 12 students studying Agriculture, Animal, and Veterinary Sciences who are in their third year, or completing Honours. In preparation for the competition, the team have been training hard since the start of semester one, each week attending theory and practicals which sometimes start as early as 6am! This hard work paid off immeasurably during the competition and our students thoroughly enjoyed the event.

The Wagga program provided students the opportunity to hear from the best in the business, including international guest speakers covering broad areas along the whole red meat value chain. There were also plentiful networking opportunities with industry leaders who have really built their name in the business, as well as with fellow students from ten Australian Universities and five international teams hailing from Indonesia, Japan, Korea and the United States (YES – meat judging is that big a deal that overseas teams make the trip to compete!).

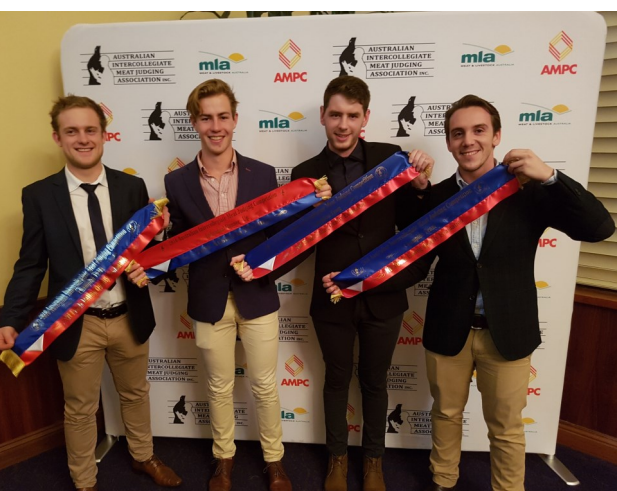
The competition is based on judging, similar to that at Adelaide Royal of live animals, only we judge carcasses instead. By evaluating a carcass, we can determine many factors including sex, age, and quality – we don't need to try a steak to know how good it will taste! Students judge several carcass classes covering beef, lamb and pork, and must also be able to identify primals and retail cuts. This year the Adelaide team of Jordy Kitschke, Brodhi Carracher, Joshua Angove and Curtis Villani won Champion Team for Eating Quality Evaluation. Brodhi Carracher was also Runner-up individual for Placings (by only two points!). This year's competition was the most competitive yet with only 4 points separating the top five placing students overall, and Adelaide University finished strongly amongst tough competition.

Jordy Kitschke was selected to attend an industry training sponsored by Meat and Livestock Australia to be held in Brisbane in August. This week of training is only open to the top ten placing students, as well as one student from each university, selected by the team coach.

In the week prior to leaving for Wagga, the team spent valuable time getting to know and training with five students from Bogor Agricultural University, Indonesia. Many students from the Adelaide Meat Judging Team will travel to Indonesia later this year during the annual Livestock Production Tour where they'll be hosted by the friends they made during this time.

The first showdown was won convincingly by the Panthers 37-23 who were firing on all cylinders. Dany led the team in that game scoring 12 points followed closely by Tomm who scored 9. Fortunately Ramrods were able to reclaim their pride in the second showdown thanks to the efforts Darren Trott and Keith who led the team to win by 3.

Mention should be made of the new recruits Peter, Hampus, George, Taylor and Henry who have come a long way since the start of the season. Their fundamentals and awareness of the game have improved more than we could have hoped for. As a result we go into semester 2 with high hopes and the goal of making it into finals.

We would also like to thank the spectators who consistently come out to watch our games when prac tests and exams aren't looming. The games al-

The cause is the Nzikasi project, run by Wildlife Vets South Africa. Twenty-four Final Year vet students are travelling to South Africa to work with Wildlife Vets in 2016. Communities living in the Nzikasi area on the border of Kruger National Park utilise small cattle herds as their main source of income. Unfortunately, these domestic cattle are susceptible to diseases passed onto them from hardy wildlife over park borders. Wildlife vets provide vaccinations, parasite control and lameness treatments to these cattle to ensure their profitability in support of the local communities. As a bonus, these interactions with the cattle allows vets to inspect for, and monitor potential spread of, notifiable diseases such as Foot and Mouth disease.

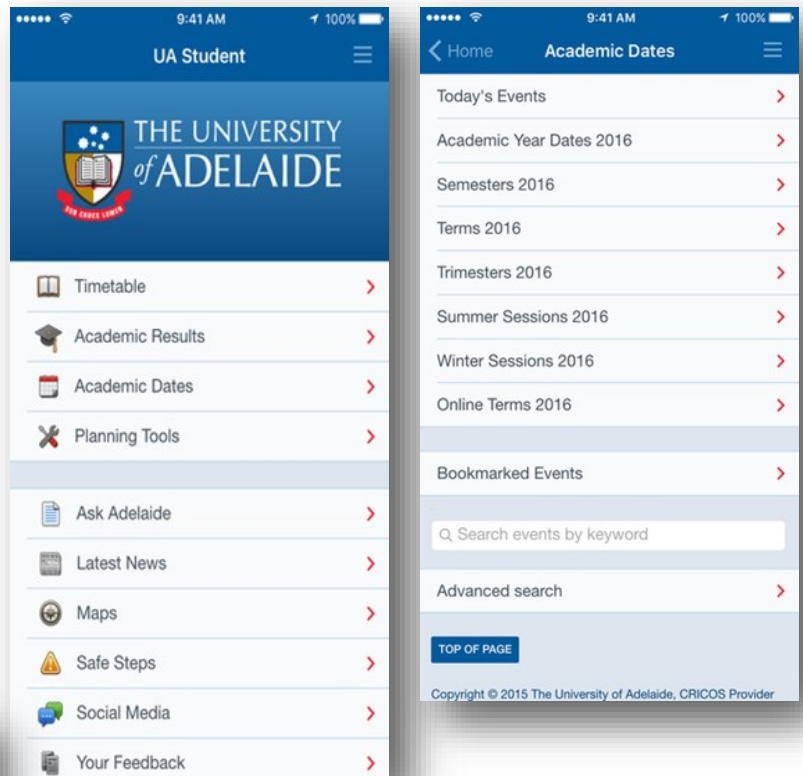

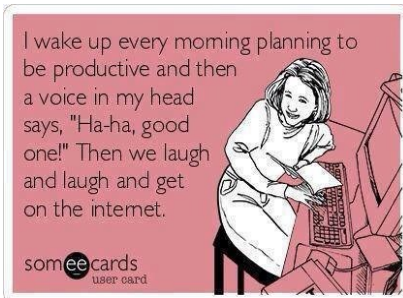

## DOES THIS SOUND FAMILIAR?

If so, you may be the perfect procrastinator



I'm a perfectionist with a procrastinator complex. Some day I'm going to be awesome.



There are a range of factors that contribute to procrastination such as:

- Perfectionism:** "If I can't do it well now I'll do it later when it will be done better."
- Fear of failure:** "I would be so humiliated if I didn't get a good mark; I just couldn't face it!"
- As an excuse:** "I could have done better if I had more time!"
- The effect of messages you have received in your past:** "You are stupid! You will have to work much harder than anyone else."
- Internal thoughts:** "I am a hopeless case if I don't get a good mark."
- Problems with decision making:** "I don't know which is the most important or where to begin."
- Feeling overwhelmed and paralysed by too much work:** "There is too much; I can't get it done in time."

Have you found yourself having thoughts to put off the work you need to do? For example:

- "I won't be able to do it properly today because there isn't enough time."
- "I'm too tired."
- "I need more references."  
"There are too many distractions."

### IDENTIFY YOUR PARTICULAR SIGNS OF PROCRASTINATION

...How do you know you are procrastinating?

...What do you do to procrastinate?

...Identify situations or areas in which you procrastinate.



### Tips to help you stop procrastinating!

**Procrastination = needless stress for you.** By procrastinating, you put yourself under an energy-draining emotional strain. Procrastination is the opposite of success!

**Make a list of what needs to be done** – prioritise the list and make it achievable. If there's too much on the list it will be overwhelming. Break long lists down into daily goals – spread it out over a realistic timeframe.

**Breakdown overwhelming tasks into small ones** – every goal can be broken down into smaller more manageable parts.

**Do a start-up task to break the stalemate.** If your goal is to get an assignment completed, go to the library and check out some interesting books and periodicals on the subject or do some research on the internet. Start with something that you find easy or interesting and get on a roll!

**Work on your goal for a set period of time.** Set a timer for 30 – 50mins and ensure you're in an environment conducive to achieving your goal. Have a break at the end of this time and then get back into it!

**Determine your most productive time of the day and use it to your advantage!** Do the most important or difficult tasks when you're most productive and leave more routine tasks (ie photocopying) when you're at your least productive.

**Lastly, reward yourself for meeting your goals beginning with your first steps.** Treat yourself for achieving your goal!

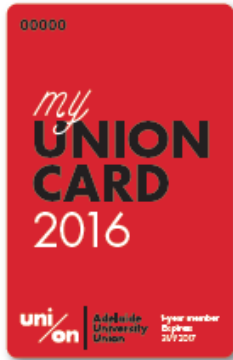
