Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) students **must be** vaccinated against Q-Fever (unless initial skin test indicates pre-existing immunity).

Bachelor of Science (Animal Science) students are **strongly advised** to vaccinate against Q-Fever (unless initial skin test indicates pre-existing immunity).

For all **new Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience)** students you **must** be vaccinated by the last day of the first teaching period of their veterinary studies. **DUE: Friday 17th June 2016**

You can also access the café and Roseworthy Student Services administration team by coming in from the side door of the dining hall or entering through a door adjacent to the Council Room.

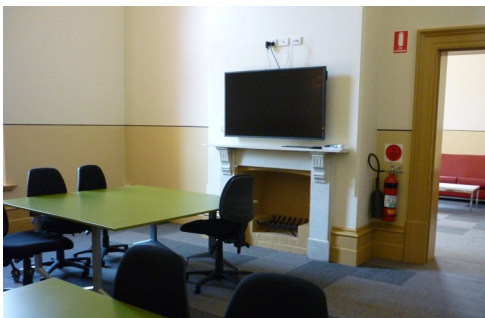
The Student Services team will continue to have resources, including information flyers about study and health, A3 study planners, calendars, campus maps and more located in the Roseworthy College Hall.

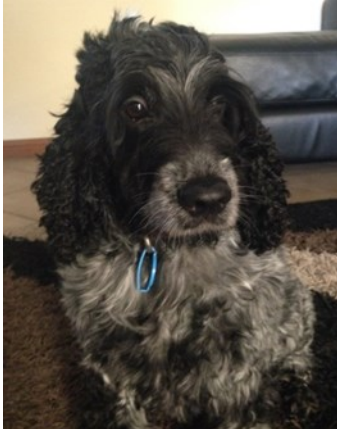

We not only look at physical or practical assistance, but we also look at ways to improve study habits in the University environment. If you're worried about your privacy, please don't be. We value your privacy. Our strong commitment to confidentiality supports all students that we assist.

What types of disabilities do we support?

Student disabilities can include a wide range of issues:

- Learning disabilities* (such as dyslexia, dyspraxia or writing and reading difficulties)
- Medical conditions* (such as Crohns Disease, Chronic Fatigue Syndrome etc)
- Mental illness* (an anxiety disorder such as OCD or PTSD, depression, bipolar disorder)
- Sensory impairments (vision or hearing)
- Mobility issues*
- Brain injury* (such as strokes or injuries caused by accidents)

Disabilities and conditions do not have to be permanent. We assist students with temporary medical issues such as

those caused by sporting accidents (a fractured limb).

How can the Disability Service assist you?

We can work out ways that you can fulfil the expectations of your studies whilst maintaining the required academic standards. Sometimes people can feel overwhelmed about being faced with these expectations. Remember, it is not about avoiding these expectations; it is about working with them.

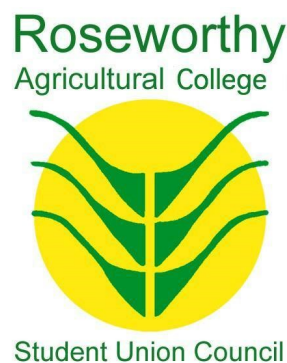
RACSUC—Roseworthy Agricultural College Student Union Council

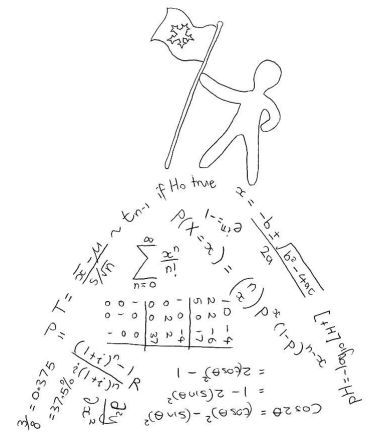
David from the MLC will be at Roseworthy throughout the year to be part of various classes in your courses. He can also come to run workshops or drop-in sessions if students or staff ask.
