NEWS FROM SAVS

Q-FEVER

Q-Fever is an infectious disease and the School has <u>guidelines</u> around Q-Fever vaccinations. It states that:

<u>Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience)</u> students **must be** vaccinated against Q-Fever (unless initial skin test indicates pre-existing immunity).

Bachelor of Science (Animal Science) students are strongly advised to vaccinate against Q-Fever (unless initial skin test indicates pre-existing immunity).

For all <u>new</u> Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) students you <u>must</u> be vaccinated by the last day of the first teaching period of their veterinary studies. **DUE: Friday 17**th **June 2016**







THE DISABILITY SERVICE

Have you got a medical condition that impacts on your studies? Do you need support to manage this condition and your studies? If so, maybe you should register with the Disability Service.

The Disability Service can help you manage ways to accommodate your disability whilst at Uni so you can focus your energies towards your studies. We not only look at physical or practical assistance, but we also look at ways to improve study habits in the University environment. If you're worried about your privacy, please don't be. We value your privacy. Our strong commitment to confidentiality supports all students that we assist.

What types of disabilities do we support?

Student disabilities can include a wide range of issues:

- ☐ Learning disabilities (such as dyslexia, dyspraxia or writing and reading difficulties)
- ☐ *Medical conditions* (such as Crohns Disease, Chronic Fatigue Syndrome etc)
- ☐ *Mental illness* (an anxiety disorder such as OCD or PTSD, depression, bipolar disorder)
- ☐ Sensory impairments (vision or hearing)
- ☐ Mobility issues
- ☐ Brain injury (such as strokes or injuries caused by accidents)

Disabilities and conditions do not have to be permanent. We assist students with temporary medical issues such as those caused by sporting accidents (a fractured limb).

How can the Disability Service assist you?

We can work out ways that you can fulfil the expectations of your studies whilst maintaining the required academic standards. Sometimes people can feel overwhelmed about being faced with these expectations. Remember, it is not about avoiding these expectations; it is about working with them.

REGISTERING WITH THE DISABILITY SERVICE

If you think you may be eligible for this service please and would like to access support you will need to register first.

- As part of the registration process you will need to provide evidence of your disability or ongoing medical condition. If you have a Psychological Learning Assessment this can be used. If not you will
- need your medical practitioner or treating specialist to complete a Verification and Impact Statement (VIS) which can be downloaded from the Disability Service website. Please see link: http://www.adelaide.edu.au/disability/checklist/
- Other relevant information such as your SACE documentation or access plan from another university can also be uploaded.



Extra Mural Studies (EMS)

Extra Mural Studies (EMS) is a requirement for both Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) and the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine. Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) must complete 12 weeks of AHEMS (Animal Husbandry Extra Mural Studies) and the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine students must complete 23 weeks of DVM EMS.

Welcome to our new students who will be starting EMS for the first time this year. There are currently two main systems that are used to manage your EMS placements.

<u>Sonia Online</u> is a student placement system using to search for possible placement sites, book and manage your placements and complete necessary forms. This system is managed by Professional Staff for any questions please email <u>animalvetsci@adelaide.edu.au</u>.

MyUni: Academic requirements are managed by Dr Wendy Hamood (EMS Co-ordinator) through MyUni. Any questions about MyUni, diary, placement records, PLOs etc please speak to Wendy (wendy.hamood@adelaide.edu.au).

Doctor of Veterinary Medicine students should go to <u>Sonia Online</u>, Forms tab, Select "*DVM EMS Placement Request Form*" and click Add. DVM students should only complete this form if they have already contacted the site and they have agreed to host them. Please ensure you 'Submit' the form by the due date. Students can view "*DVM Placement Allocation List*" through MyUni to see where and when students have already been booked. EMS Administration staff will update this list weekly.
