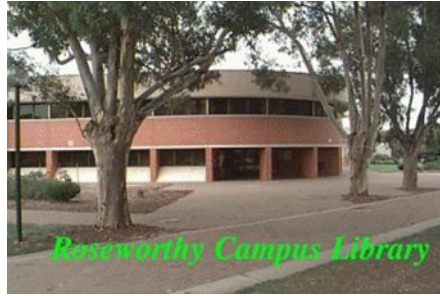

## 2015 AVBIG—Kersti Seksel Student Award

**Background:** The Kersti Seksel Student Award was established in 2012 by AVBIG (Australian Veterinary Behaviour Interest Group). It is named in honour of Kersti Seksel in recognition of her contribution to veterinary behavioural medicine in Australia.

It is open to veterinary students of an Australian veterinary school who demonstrate an interest in behavioural medicine in veterinary practice and a genuine desire to develop this interest upon graduation.

### Criteria for 2015

The Kersti Seksel Student Award is open to veterinary students (BVSc/DVM) currently studying at an Australian university.

- Winners will be selected from the applications received by the due date.
- This award focuses on the applicant's desire and potential capability for a career including behaviour in veterinary practice.
- Applicants must be current AVBIG student members. Upon receipt of the applications, membership currency will be checked (as per AVA current member database).
- Applications from non AVBIG student members will not be eligible to be judged.
- The award is not convertible to other benefit.
- While previous winners of the award are ineligible for the 2015 prize, unsuccessful applicants from previous years are encouraged to apply.

The judging panel's decision is final and no correspondence or other communication about their decision will be entered into.

If suitable applicants are not forthcoming for the current round of the award, AVBIG reserves the right to decide to withdraw all or part of the prize as they see fit.

### Prize

The top three entrants will each receive a cash prize of \$250.

### How to enter

Application forms available from the Student Services Office . Applications close on 30 September 2015. No late entries will be accepted. Successful entrants will be notified by 1 December, 2015.

## Noah's Ark Natural Animal Sanctuary (Singapore & Malaysia)

*Thank you to Dillon and Kenneth, final year vet students for sharing their experiences.*



Our placement at Noah's Ark Natural Animal Sanctuary (NANAS) was truly a memorable experience. Upon stepping into the sanctuary, we were welcomed by dogs of all breeds, ages, colours and sizes (even number of legs).

Although each of them had a different physical appearance and personality, one thing common amongst them was their freedom and happiness. This emotional state is possible because of the environment (and home) which the ark provides.

The property is aptly named a sanctuary; a safe haven for the animals, a home for abandoned, abused and neglected pets and a place where the animals are protected and taken care of.

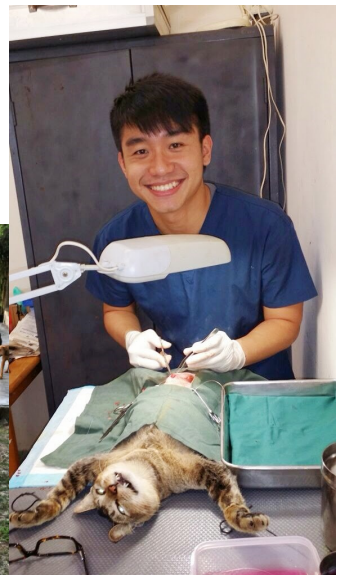
The sanctuary also houses the Animal Birth Control clinic which aims to provide low cost sterilization of animals to the community. We spent most of our first week in here, performing spay and neuter surgeries under the watchful eye of Raymund.

Under his guidance, we learnt many different surgical techniques and how to handle various situations in 'shelter' surgery. This has helped us to gain confidence and become competent in the tissue handling and resolving problems.

In our second week, we were given the opportunity to perform numerous sterilizations on stray animals and pets in the different communities in Muar and Malacca. This has helped us to further develop our knowledge and skills set.

Besides the technical skills, we were also able to grasp a good understanding of shelter medicine. Raymund also shared with us the structure of the organization and its role in reducing the number of stray animals on the street. Through our interaction with him, we gained an insight into his passion and love for the animals, which is what motivates him everyday.

Among the many conversations we had with Raymund, there is one thing that stands out. He told us - the only way an animal can reciprocate your support and kindness (choosing to rescue, save, treat them etc) is with its love and affection. It is this innocence and purity that compels people to give back to the animal society







In summary, our experience at Noah's Ark has been a rewarding and meaningful one. We would like to express our gratitude to Raymund and his staff for their kind hospitality and for providing us with delicious food each meal.

We would encourage anyone reading this to find out more about Noah's Ark Natural Animal Sanctuary, to share in its vision and join its cause in providing a better tomorrow for all animals.
