Have you tried searching **Zoological Record**?

This database includes systematic and taxonomic information for 27 animal groups. Topics include behaviour, biochemistry, disease, genetics, physiology, habitat, development and life-cycle and more.

It includes over 3,200 unique titles not found on Web of Science or Biosis.

Zoological Record is on the Web of Knowledge platform and is available from the Databases tab on the Animal and Veterinary Sciences Resource Guide
