## Animal Husbandry Extra Mural Studies

Welcome back all – especially those students new to the campus

### First year students

Animal Handling and Husbandry needs to be successfully completed before you can start attending AHEMS placements. Animal Science students wanting to gain animal handling and industry experience are able to attend animal husbandry placements also.

### New Students transferring into Pre Vet – 2<sup>nd</sup> year

You will be required to complete an assignment for Vets Skills II based on an AHEMS placement. Those students who have not yet done an AHEMS placement will need to see Judy Tucker or Wendy Hamood to get a placement organised for the Mid Semester break of 1<sup>st</sup> Semester. We have set aside some placements specifically for this purpose.

### Prior experience

If you believe you have sufficient prior experience you may claim for an exemption for 2 weeks AHEMS. This needs to be submitted by the **1<sup>st</sup> June 2012**.

### Students who have completed AHEMS placements over the summer vacation

You should be familiar with the routine but just in case please note the following reminders

- Online feedback needs to be submitted for every placement attended
- Last day for accepting report **13<sup>th</sup> March 2012** (These should be completed and ready for submission on your first day back)
- If you require an extension due to illness, difficulty circumstances or you still have another week of placement to complete an extension application must be lodged but **1<sup>st</sup> March 2012**.
- **LATE REPORTS ARE NOT ACCEPTED**

If you found your AHEMS placement to be an inspiring experience please submit a half page article that would be suitable to post on the EMS Web page.

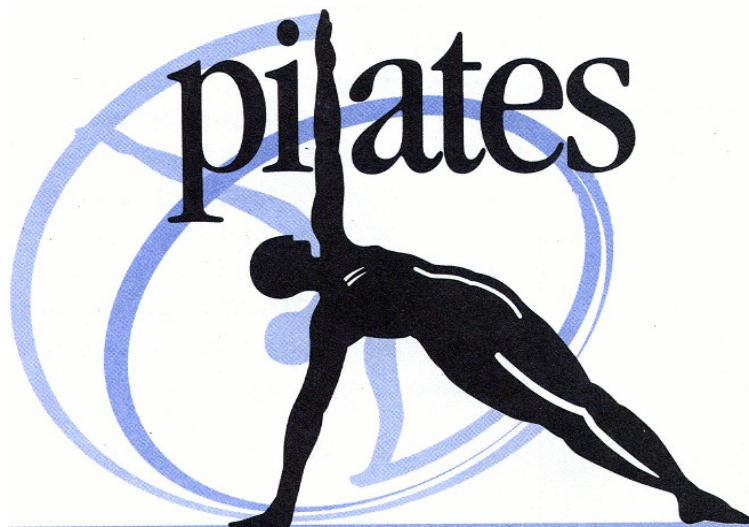

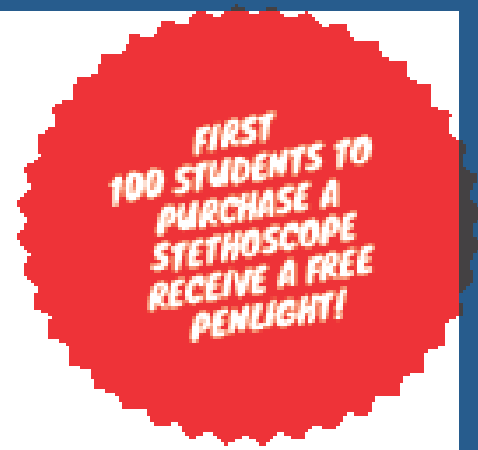
