#### **NEWS FROM THE APO**







The Roseworthy Steer team competed at the Gawler Show as a practice run before Adelaide. The team was very successful with all five Handlers placing in the top line of the handlers competition; Ainslie Colbert 1st Brooke Crowell 2nd Amy Murray 3rd Sam Fischer 5th and Jessie Thomson 6th. The steers then went on to be judged in a large class of about 20 other steers. The success continued with four out of our five steers placing winning 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 5th. The steers then went to Adelaide were the competition was much tougher, the Simmental steer placed in the O'Conner team (top 3 simis for the show) with our Angus and Murray Grey coming very close to been selected. In the steer classes one of our Murray Greys placed 2nd in his class, the Simi placed 5th in his class. All steers then went on to be judged on hook with our smaller Murray grey winning reserve champion light weight steer on hook and all other steers placed well.
