

Is the present system of examination a fair test of capacity? There are many who declare it is not. Notable among these is Dr. Cyril Norwood, head master of Harrow, who says that it is "indefensible."

He suggests that every school which has been properly inspected and reported as efficent should issue its own certificates, declaring that the pupils have attended for so many years and reached a satisfactory level of performance.
