search. "In spite of Australia's natural advantages, the dairying industry is in an unsatisfactory position," Mr. Bruce said.

"It is evident that the outcome of this is the high cost of production, which is caused to a great extent by the low buiter fat yield in comparison with our prin cipal competitors.
