She graduated with honors in Latin, French, educational history, English, and philosophy in 1913. In 1917, at the request of the Methodist Foreign Missionary Society, she was nominated by the New South Wales Education Department to establish Methodist mission schools in Fiji. For four years she did excellent service in this connection. She was assistant mistress of the Sydney High School for some time. Later she was appointed headmistress of the Ravenswood Methodist Ladies' College. She comes to Adelaide with the highest credentials.

# NEW GOVERNOR HOLDS FIRST LEVEE.

## USHERED IN BY WELCOME RAIN.

## QUIET BUT IMPRESSIVE GATHERING.

### REPRESENTATIVE GATHERING AT GOVERNMENT HOUSE.

Grey skies through which the sun peeped wanly, and a chill wind holding a threat of further rain ushered in Sir Alexander Hore-Ruthven's first levee in South Australia on Tuesday morning, but they were conditions which augured well for the State's prosperity, and those present felt that the occasion was being held in more than usually auspicious circumstances. In a procession through the viceregal parties, which was somewhat shortened by weather conditions, there was a most representative attendance of citizens, the naval and military uniforms and silk robes of University professors lending a dash of colour to the sombreness of the morning.

Long before the ceremony began, however, public interest was manifested by the gathering of a crowd outside the gates, who formed a lane through which notabilities of all forms of official public life filed into the grounds.

Before the imposing old mansion itself a guard of honour and band from the 48th Battalion stood at attention, in command of Capt. A. Pope, and Lieuts. H. F. Beaney (carrying the King's colours) and W. E. Angus, the band being under W. O. H. Smith (drum-major).

At noon His Excellency, in scarlet uniform, preceded by his aides—Capt. Verney and Lieut. the Hon. Hugh Grosvenor—and accompanied by His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor and Chief Justice (Sir George Murray), the Premier (Hon. R. L. Butler), the Acting District Naval Officer (Lieut.-Commander W. Hill, R.A.N.), and the Base Military Commandant (Brig.-Gen. O. F. Phillips), emerged from Government House and took the salute on the lawn as the guard sprang to the "Present" and the band broke into the National Anthem.

His Excellency then pinned upon the breasts of Professor R. W. Chapman and Mr. Legh Winser their Order of C.M.G., and the I.S.O. upon Mr. C. H. Dewhurst (Secretary to the Commissioner of Public Works). The Colonial Auxiliary Forces officers' decoration was conferred upon Lieut.-Col. T. R. Mellor, O.B.E., 13th Brigade, A.F.A., and long-service medals upon Capt. D. J. Cox, 23rd Light Horse Regiment, and Sgt. J. W. Birchmore, 13th Brigade, A.F.A.

The viceregal party then re-entered Government House, the procession, which had formed up on the drive, passing through the front entrance and on to the ballroom before His Excellency. In the forefront were the members and staff of both Houses of the State Legislature, and then came members of the City Council, with the Lord Mayor's orderly carrying the mace, members of the Unley City Council, the staff of educational institutions, colleges, and the University, military officers, civic dignitaries, representatives of local governing bodies, and officers of the civil service; police inspectors, led by Brig.-Gen. R. L. Leane (Police Commissioner), and members of the legal profession, and the public.
