> it The investigations of Mendel, a priest in Silesia, had been rediscovered. Mendel had formulated certain laws of heredity, which were now called by his name. The first proposition was that human beings inherited all their qualities as units. It was a startling idea that a quality like longevity should be inherited as a unit factor. It seemed to be so, and all sorts of things like fertility, colour, size, resistance to disease, abnormalities, and diseases, should behave as Mendelian units. Each of those factors was represented in the body by two units, or

genes, one coming from each parent. The two genes might be the same in kind, or they might be opposite—as one for tallness, and one for shortness, or both for the same thing. The essential point, however, was that when the germ cells were formed only one gene, and never two, entered the cell. That was known as Mendel's first law of the segregation of the
