Q-FEVER

Q-Fever is an infectious disease and the School has guidelines around Q-Fever vaccinations. It states that:

Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) students must be vaccinated against Q-Fever (unless initial skin test indicates pre-existing immunity).

Bachelor of Science (Animal Science)

students are strongly advised to vaccinate against Q-Fever (unless initial skin test indicates pre-existing immunity).

For all new Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) students you must be vaccinated by the last day of the first teaching period of their veterinary studies. DUE: Friday 16th June 2017.

What types of disabilities do we support?

Student disabilities can include a wide range of issues:

- · Learning disabilities (such as dyslexia, dyspraxia or writing and reading difficulties)
- Medical conditions (such as Crohns Disease, Chronic Fatigue Syndrome
- Mental illness (an anxiety disorder such as OCD or PTSD, depression, bipolar disorder)
- Sensory impairments (vision or hearing)
- Mobility issues
- Brain injury (such as strokes or injuries caused by accidents)

Disabilities and conditions do not have to be permanent. We assist students with temporary medical issues such as those caused by sporting accidents (a fractured limb).

Extra Mural Studies (EMS)



Extra Mural Studies (EMS) is a requirement for both Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) and the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine. Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) must complete 12 weeks of AHEMS (Animal Husbandry Extra Mural Studies) and the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine students must complete 23 weeks of DVM EMS.

Welcome to our new students who will be starting EMS for the first time this year. There are currently two main systems that are used to manage your EMS placements.

<u>Sonia Online</u> is our student placement system used to search for possible placement sites, book and manage your placements and complete necessary forms and diaries. Thailand Study Tour

On 21st January, 11 2nd/3rd year Vet Bio students travelled with Dr Stephen Pycroft to Bangkok for a two-week aguaculture and production animal study tour. Sunday was spent exploring the city, including scenic Lumpini Park and Chinese New Year markets.

Monday was our first placement day, at Rayong Coastal and Marine Conservation Centre & Muang Turtle Sanctuary, where we held and bled baby sea turtles - it was turtley incredible! Tuesday we learnt how to sedate and examine fish and performed necropsies on stingrays and shrimp at Rajamangala University. Wednesday was our 'cultural day' which we spent at the beautiful floating markets. Thursday consisted of tours around the Aquaculture Fisheries Research and Development Centre, Asian Institute of Technology & Tilapia Hatchery. The Institute of Marine Science at Burapha University on Friday off with some sight-seeing and night was great as we learnt about the con-



struction and filtration systems of their Our second week was led by Dr Roy aquarium and hand-fed stingrays! Saturday was the trip highlight, feeding and swimming with rescued elephants at Elephants World. Sunday was our wellneeded day of rest & recovery, topped markets.

Kirkwood, starting with a tour around the Chulalongkorn University Small Animal Hospital (awesome) and an adrenalin-filled afternoon at the Thai Red Cross Society Snake Farm, complete with striking cobras and Burmese python cuddles. Tuesday we visited Thailand's largest piggery and Wednesday Chulalongkorn Univeristy's Large Animal facility. Thursday we visited Murrah Buffalo Dairy farm and tried milking buffalo observed the making of buffalo mozzarella. Chokchai Dairy on Friday spelled the end of our two weeks of placement and time in Bangkok.

We all developed greatly both as individuals and vet students, learning invaluable lessons about aquaculture and production animals in Thailand. We highly recommend the trip to students who may be interested next year, it's a once in a lifetime experience that you'll never forget!




