Just a reminder about Q-Fever. Q-Fever is an infectious disease and the School has Vaccination Guidelines around Q-Fever vaccinations. It states that:

- Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) students must be vaccinated against Q-Fever (unless initial skin test indicates pre-existing immunity).
- Bachelor of Science (Animal Science) students are strongly advised to vaccinate against Q-Fever (unless initial skin test indicates pre-existing immunity).

For all new Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) students must provide us with proof of their vaccination by: Friday 16th June 2017. Student should log onto [Sonia](#) and upload evidence of their Q-Fever Vaccination via the "Checks" Tab. Instructions can be found [here \(SONIA USER GUIDE \(Student\) No 15. 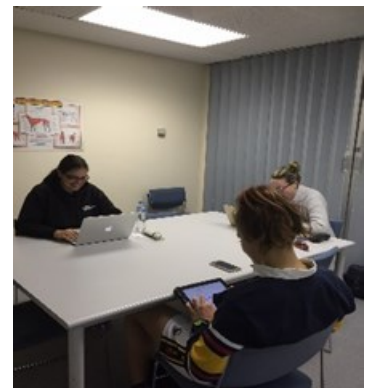

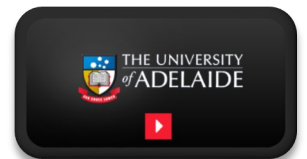

Exam Preparation

It's almost that time of year when you have the opportunity to show your course co-ordinators and lecturers just how amazing you are and how much you've learnt this semester! So, how do you prepare for that moment of demonstrating your brilliance???

Here's how.....

- ◇ Think about
- ◇ What topics will be examined?
- ◇ How will you be assessed? – Multiple Choice?
- ◇ Short answer?
- ◇ Open book?
- ◇ What is the exam worth as a percentage of your final grade?
- ◇ Attend all lectures, tutorials and workshops
- ◇ Clarify any terms/diagrams/calculations etc. that are unclear
- ◇ List keywords and practise their definitions
- ◇ Read the prescribed text(s) and set reading(s)
- ◇ Review your notes starting from week 1 and highlight the main points.
- ◇ Exam Revision Timetable – manageable 'chunks'
- ◇ Summarise usefully – link ideas and concepts (concept or mind maps)
- ◇ Review Questions
- ◇ Past exam papers
- ◇ Study groups or peers
- ◇ Think up exam questions and try to answer them

Leading up to the exam

- ◇ Avoid last minute cramming
- ◇ Eat well before you sit for an exam for energy and concentration.
- ◇ Ensure you are well rested. Don't cram!
- ◇ Check that you have all the material you need for the exam e.g. calculator(s), pen(s), pencil(s), eraser(s), and text(s) if it is an open book exam.
- ◇ Keep away from other stressed students while waiting for the exam.

On the day of the exam

- ◇ Arrive at the exam venue in plenty of time.
- ◇ Try to relax once you are there. Take a few slow, deep breaths and consciously relax any tense muscles.
- ◇ Use the allocated reading time to read the instructions carefully and look through the questions.
- ◇ Work out which questions have the highest percentage of marks attached and allocate time accordingly.
- ◇ Answer the question(s) you feel confident about first. This will get you started and build your confidence.

Don't forget that to dazzle them with your brilliance you will also need to look after yourself.

Here's how.....

Implement good sleep habits to help your memory

- ◇ 8 hours of restful sleep per night, go to the bed at the same time each night and wind down before bed (no devices such as ipads, tablets or computers in the hour or so leading up to bed)

Eat a well-balanced diet & drink plenty of water

- ◇ Limit caffeine which can increase anxiety, avoid sugary & spicy foods before bed

Get regular exercise

- ◇ Go for a walk, play sport, do yoga, go to the gym but no exercise just before bed

Utilise good study habits

- ◇ Prepare a study space, draw up a study plan, set realistic goals, prioritise and focus!

Plan your study time

- ◇ Too much material + too little time = Anxiety. Plan your studying with regularly scheduled study sessions about 50 minutes long separated by 5 – 10 minute breaks.

Avoid distractions and procrastinating

- ◇ Procrastination is a thief of time! Ban your devices during study time unless absolutely necessary.....they are can be a big distraction!

Reward yourself for achieving your exam revision goals each day

- ◇ Take a break & socialise with your friends, listen to music, watch TV, colour in – get out of the study headspace

Keep things in perspective

- ◇ Your exams might seem like the most important thing right now but, in the big picture of your whole life, they are only a small part.

You are required to bring with you to the exam venue:

- your student ID (or other photo identification)
- reasonable supplies of all required writing materials, erasers, etc.

Materials permitted:

- a small purse or wallet, including keys, money, ID & credit cards
- one clear bottle of clear water, up to 1 litre in size (water is available at the venue)
- a closed bag stored under your seat
- any materials specified by the examiner, as set out on the front page of the exam paper

Materials not permitted, unless specified by the examiner, as set out in the front cover of the examination paper:

You **must not** bring into the examination venue any material which enables, or has the potential to enable, you or others to cheat or to gain an unfair academic advantage. Examples of materials which **are not** permitted include, but are not limited to:

- writing or other paper
- dictionaries, textbooks, notes or other reference material not specified on the front page of the exam paper
- electronic devices including: calculators, diaries, dictionaries, organisers, laptop or palmtop computers, mobile telephones, or other communication devices unless specified by the examiner (and only self-powered that operate quietly would be acceptable).
- any drinks other than clear water in a clear container

Materials NOT to be removed:

You must not remove from the venue any materials issued for use in the examination, or any copies of such materials. All such materials remain the property of the University, whether the materials were actually used or not. These includes scripts, blank answer books, question papers and drawing or scribble paper.

Bags

Students bringing **bags** into the exam venue may be subject to inspection as you enter the venue. Place all the materials you will need on your desk, close your bag and store it under your seat. Any items not permitted in the exam must be stored in your bag and not your pockets.

Mobile Phones

You are not permitted to bring your mobile phone into the exam venue unless it is switched off and stored in your closed bag under your seat.

If a mobile phone is found switched on in your possession during the exam it will be deemed as a breach of the policy and will be held as unauthorised material and returned to you at the end of the exam. This may result in the matter being referred to the Head of School for further action in accordance with the Academic Dishonesty Procedures.

Replacement/Additional Assessment

Changes to the [Modified Arrangements for Coursework Assessment \(MACA\) Policy](#) came into affect in 2016. For a summary of the changes click here: [summary of changes](#).

Before the Primary Examination

Students with an illness and/or exceptional personal circumstances must submit their application for R/AA to their School or Faculty **no later than 3 business days** after the occurrence of the condition, illness and/or exceptional personal circumstances, which form the grounds on which their application is made, regardless of the date of the primary exam.

During the Primary Examination

Students who become ill on the way to or during the exam must notify an exam invigilator at the venue and apply for a replacement exam **within 3 business days** of the date of the primary exam.

Animal Science Work Experience

The University supports career readiness for students across all programs. While the veterinary students have compulsory Extra Mural Studies (EMS) placements that they need to complete to graduate this is not a requirement for the Animal Science program. However, work experience is valuable and the School would like to support Animal Science students to undertake work experience however there are some guidelines that need to be adhered to.

Where can I go to do Work Experience?

Animal Science students cannot attend veterinary clinics. If a site a student wishes to attend already exists in the Sonia (student placement system) students must speak to the EMS Administration team (**do not** contact the site directly). If the site is new and does not exist in Sonia please contact the EMS Administration team (animalvetsci@adelaide.edu.au) and they can advise how to organise the placement.

How do I book work experience?

If the site already exists in Sonia, Animal Science students must complete an AHEMS Placement Preference Form via Sonia by the due date (refer to AHEMS due dates below). EMS Administration will allocate students accordingly. Please note that where requests are received for the same placement priority will be given to veterinary students as they require placements to graduate. For some locations (e.g. Adelaide / Monarto Zoo) some placements, however, will be allocated to Animal Science students each placement period. All Animal Science work experience placements will be sent to Dr Karen Kind for her approval. Students will be emailed by the EMS Administration Team when the September Placement Preference form is available.

Placement Requirements

All students regardless of program require approval to attend placements and will need to complete a Student Placement Agreement (SPA) before the placement and a Student Assessment of Placement (SAP) after the placement.

Who should I contact?

Dr Karen Kind is the Bachelor of Science (Animal Science) Program Co-ordinator and approves Animal Science student placements organised through the School.

The EMS Administration Team (Mandi Simpson & Kat Ingram) should be Animal Science students' first point of call as Mandi and Kat will be managing the actual placements and associated paperwork and will gain approval from Dr Kind.

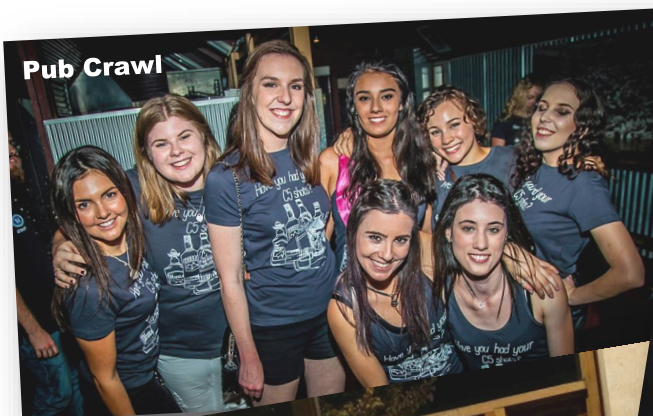
