1954 GRADUATES

The stalwarts of the 1954 graduation year have a "weekend to remember" planned at the time of the 2004 ROCA AGM and Reunion Dinner. They will meet informally an hour before the dinner on Friday evening to make sure that all present know each other, before they venture into the dinner.

Saturday morning will see them inspecting the Wine Division at the Waite Institute, before heading to "Woodstock" in the Southern Vales for lunch. On Sunday the survivors of all of that will gather at the home of Mick Lucey at Echunga for an informal barbecue.

2003 ROCA AWARD OF MERIT

The forty-third ROCA Award of Merit was presented at the 2003 Reunion Dinner to Philip Laffer RDA, RDOen. The award highlights meritorious and outstanding service to Agriculture, Roseworthy Campus, ROCA and the Community, attributes which were described in his citation at the reunion presentation by the ROCA President.



Mr Philip Laffer, the chief winemaker with the Orlando-Wyndham group, graduated from Roseworthy in 1961 with a Diploma of Agriculture then studied oenology at the college, graduating in 1963.

Phil Laffer's contribution has taken place at all levels across the wine industry -- from vineyard practices and winemaking procedures to quality standards, quality control and marketing.

He recognised the importance of the market chain sooner than most and has devoted substantial time into the coordination of grape production and market practices, which meet consumer expectations.

Phil has shuttled between Australia and North America, Japan and Europe

enhancing and expanding Australia's wine export drive -- one result being that the Jacob's Creek range is the biggest selling Australian wine label in the world.

Mr Laffer's energies and expertise had also been utilised by many wine industry groups including

research organisations, industry representation groups and government advisory groups. At all times his focus has been on achieving practical outcomes to benefit the wine industry. Phil is a significant face for the Australian wine industry at home and abroad, and in 2002 he was named Australia's Winemaker of the Year.

He is an inaugural Co-Patron of the Roseworthy Student and Campus Fund.

His outstanding achievements reflect the high standard maintained over the years by fellow alumni who have been awarded ROCA's highest honour, including Phil's father, the late Len Laffer, who received the Award of Merit in 1976.

In his acceptance address, Phil thanked ROCA for recognising his achievements and acknowledged the opportunities which his training and experience at Roseworthy had given to him.

Since 1961, forty-three notable Old Collegians have been honoured by the Association for meritorious and outstanding service to agriculture, the Campus, ROCA or the community. 

CALL FOR VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS TO ROCA

At the 2003 ROCA AGM, the treasurer's report raised serious concerns for the long-term projection of the ROCA finances. While our present position is not critical [with \$35,000 invested in term deposits] we have had a net deficit for the last 2 years, and it seems highly likely that this trend will continue.

The reason for our predicament is our very low income in terms our membership base – we have approximately 1500 members, yet we are lucky to receive as many as 10 new life members each year, and these contribute a one-off membership subscription of \$60.00. In addition, with interest rates still relatively low, the income from our investments is modest. On the other hand, costs continue to rise, and in months to come ROCA will have to make a significant financial contribution to launch the Roseworthy Student and Campus Fund (see elsewhere in this issue).

The issue of our finances was discussed at some length at the AGM, and three main points emerged:

- 1. A very strong desire that ROCA should continue to exist.
- 2. That a one-off contribution of \$60.00 is a very modest fee for life membership in any organisation.
- 3. That a large majority of ROCA members would have contributed a considerably lesser sum when they took out life membership many would have contributed in the vicinity of £5.00.

Accordingly, a motion was passed by the meeting that: "A voluntary call for a \$50.00 donation (to ROCA) from all members be made, based on current need and the low initial joining fees".

It should be noted that this request is directed not so much to ROCA members who have joined recently, but more towards long standing members. The ROCA Committee would be very grateful if you are able to make a donation.
