

PRINCE GEORGE AS DUKE OF KENT
"Gazette" Announcement
 (British Official Wireless)

LONDON, October 9.—The "London Gazette" tonight contains an announcement that the King has conferred the dignity of Duke of Kent upon his son Prince George. The terms of announcement are as follows:

"The King has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the Realm, granting unto His Majesty's son His Royal Highness Prince George Edward Alexander Edmund, K.G. G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O. and heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, the dignities of Baron Downpatrick, Earl of Saint Andrews and Duke of Kent."

The title of Duke of Kent was last borne by Queen Victoria's father, who died in 1820.

Royal approval has been given for the broadcasting of the wedding of Prince George and Princess Marino on November 29, according to "The Daily Mail."

It will be relayed to every English-speaking nation and probably to most foreign countries.

Eight microphones in Westminster Abbey, including one hidden beneath the pectern, will enable the service and the "I wills" of the Prince and Princess to be carried across the world.

SCOUT AND GUIDE RALLY
Free Admission For Public
 Arrangements have been completed for the rally of scouts and guides, and brownies, in the presence of H.R.H. the Duke of Gloucester and His Excellency the Governor (Sir Winston Dugan) and Lady Dugan, on the Jubilee Oval tomorrow.

The Governor and Lady Dugan will arrive at 10.20 a.m., and the Duke at 10.30 a.m. The president of the Boy Scouts' Association (Mr. J. L. Leal), the Chief Commissioner (Dr. C. T. Madigan), the State General Commissioner (Mr. F. J. Mills), the president of the Girl Guides' Association (Mrs. K. D. Cowman), the Deputy Chief Commissioner (Mrs. R. R. Rudall), and the State organizer secretary (Miss V. A. Ralph) will be presented to His Royal Highness by the Scouts and Guides.

The thousands of boys and girls in uniform will march past, led by their respective scouts and guides, in charge of their respective sections. Many of the scouts and guides will be from the country.

Admission to the oval will be free. The public will be admitted through the two gates off Frome road. These will be open about 9.30 a.m. An area has been set apart for ticket holders representing various committees of the association and special guests.

The ticket-holders will proceed through the main entrance of the University on North terrace, and through the most convenient gate of the University, off Victoria Drive. It had been arranged for ticket holders to park their cars in the University grounds, but this cannot now be permitted.

A description of the rally will be broadcast from the oval through the various local stations by Mr. F. J. Mills. Loud speakers will be erected on the oval.

Experienced Men In New Posts
 The new comers in the Ministry are Mr. Menzies, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Harrison, Sir Henry Gullett, and Senator Brennan, Victoria, and New South Wales each five Ministers, and the other States one each. In the last Ministry New South Wales had five Ministers, Victoria four, Tasmania two, and the other States one each.

Sir Henry Gullett will bring his valuable experience of trade matters to bear upon the negotiation of trade treaties, a branch of the Commonwealth's work which has not received lately the attention which many members of the House demanded. With Mr. Bruce, Sir Henry Gullett negotiated Australia's part of the Ottawa Agreement, and he is fully conversant with the international implications involved therein.

Mr. Menzies brings into his new office a valuable political experience, for he is a former Deputy Premier, Attorney-General and Minister for Railways in Victoria.

Senator T. C. Brennan, K.C., has been a Senator for Victoria since 1931. He has a distinguished legal career, and is an exponent of Constitutional Law. The Labor member for Betman, Mr. P. Brennan, is a brother. Senator Brennan is 60 years of age.

According to the order in which Mr. Lyons announced his Ministry, Senator Sir George Pearce has been given precedence over Mr. Menzies. This is in accordance with Mr. Lyons' earlier announcement that Sir George Pearce would be Acting Prime Minister while Mr. Lyons is abroad early next year attending the King's Jubilee celebration.

This raises the question who will be the Ministerial leader in the House of Representatives during Mr. Lyons' absence. It is believed, however, that the order in which the Ministers have been placed by Mr. Lyons does not necessarily mean that Mr. Menzies will fill that office. The deputy leadership of the party in the House of Representatives has not yet been decided, and understood, at a party meeting to be held, probably in Canberra. At that time the Ministerial order will be laid between Mr. Parkhill and Mr. Menzies.

The new Ministry will be sworn in by the Governor-General (Sir Isaac Isaacs) at Canberra on Friday morning, after which there will be a meeting of the new cabinet, which will probably be adjourned to Melbourne.

Mr. Lyons will leave for Canberra tomorrow afternoon.

MELBOURNE, October 10. Following the failure of negotiations between the Prime Minister (Mr. Lyons) and the leader of the Australian Country Party (Dr. Page) for the formation of a coalition Ministry, Mr. Lyons proceeded to form his new Ministry from the ranks of the U.A.P. Tonight he announced that his new Federal Ministry would be as follows:

- Prime Minister and Treasurer, Mr. Lyons
- Minister for External Affairs and in charge of Territories, Senator Sir George Pearce
- Attorney-General, Mr. Menzies
- Minister for Defence, Mr. Parkhill
- Vice-President of the Executive Council and Minister for Health, Mr. Hughes
- Postmaster-General and Minister in Charge of Development, Senator McEachern
- Minister for Commerce and Industry, Mr. Stewart
- Minister for Trade and Customs, Mr. White
- Minister for the Interior, Mr. E. J. Harrison
- Assistant Treasurer, Mr. Casey
- Minister without portfolio, directing Trade Treaties, Sir Henry Gullett
- Minister without portfolio administering Repatriation and War Service Homes, Mr. Francis
- Minister for Commerce and Industry, Senator T. C. Brennan
- Assistant Minister until conclusion of Royal visit, Mr. Pearce

The unexpected feature of the new Ministry is the amalgamation of the portfolios of Commerce and Industry, both of which duties now devolve upon the same man, assisted by Senator Brennan. This, in conjunction with the appointment of Mr. Pearce as Minister for the Interior, has led to the exclusion of Mr. Perkins, who was Minister for the Interior in the last Ministry and was expected, Mr. Menzies has been given the Attorney-Generalship in succession to Mr.

STUDENTS TO ASSIST AT HOSPITAL
Arrangements to Last Until December
EFFICIENCY ENSURED

As the Adelaide Hospital has not been able to obtain young doctors from other States to fill the positions of the four house surgeons who resigned from the staff of October 2, it was decided yesterday that about 12 advanced medical students from the Adelaide Hospital would go into the hospital next week. These students, all of whom have already had at least 12 months' experience at the hospital as part of the medical course, will carry out routine duties under the direction of the medical superintendent (Dr. Steeman), the three resident-Dr. O'Connor (surgical), Margaret Cleland (medical), and Arden (out-patient)—and the remaining eight house surgeons.

Although the students will be able to give valuable assistance in this way, the depleted staff next week will be called upon to bear an increased burden of responsible duties, which cannot be handed over to the students.

Discussing the situation last night, one of the hospital doctors said that the hospital patients would not receive efficient treatment under this arrangement, which would probably last until December, when it was expected that about 40 new doctors would have qualified from the Adelaide University.

"There will probably be a certain amount of inconvenience and inconvenience under this makeshift arrangement," he said, "but, in the circumstances, that cannot be avoided."
