## PRINCIPAL MANUSCRIPT SOURCES AVAILABLE ON SAMOA

1. German administration files in Wellington.
2. British Consular records. The main collection is in Wellington, at the Nat'l Archives. There is corresponding material in the Public Record Office, London, and to some extent in certain official publications.
3. American Consular records. In National Archives in Washington. Film of 19th century material available in Canberra.
4. London Missionary Society records. In London, with some private LMS material in the Mitchell, Sydney. LMS files are being filmed in London for us.
5. Methodist Mission records. Official and private records in the Mitchell.
6. Marist Mission records. In Rome; films being obtained.
7. Samoan papers. Pre-1900 Samoan Gov't and private records available in recently recovered collections now at National Archives and Turnbull Library (both in Wellington).
8. International Land Commission records. In the charge of the Samoan Government, Apia.
9. Records of the British Military Gov't and New Zealand administration. In Wellington and Apia.

NOTE: Groups 2 through 8 deal principally with the 19th century. In addition to the above, there are also some private records which belonged to Europeans who settled in Samoa years ago or who had an early interest in Samoa. These include parts of the Gurr, Westbrook, and Stout collections at the Turnbull; the Grey papers in Auckland, the Graf papers at the A.N.U., the Bates papers at the Univ. of Delaware, the Moors papers in private hands in Manila. Note especially that the German Consular papers and the DHPG records in Apia have been lost or destroyed.

(Including: general medical reports, sanitation, leprosy, state hospital, private doctors and hospitals, pharmaceutical matters, women's nursing association, convalescent homes and bathing facilities, provision of medical care for Samoans.)

(Including: customs in general, collection of customs, general taxation and collection of various taxes, importation of arms and ammunition, customs and tax office, DHPG's private bond store.)

(Note: ceremony and protocol are dealt with in the recovered volumes. This is a public relations series so that a good deal of its contents would probably be public anyway.)

(Note: of 4 volumes on the Navy, 2 were recovered.)

XV. Missions and schools (none recovered from 17)

XVI. Foreign affairs (one recovered of 20)

(Including: general material of foreign consulates in Apia, communications with foreign states and colonies, Tonga, Tutuila, and Fiji, German colonies, foreign navies, Chinese, British, and American Consulates.)



(Note: foreign navies are covered by the one existing volume.)

HISTORY OF THE AUSTRALIAN PROJECT FOR FILMING  
CAPTURED GERMAN NAVAL RECORDS.

Also

Description of files examined, with reasons for inclusion or omission when filming for Australia. All files listed are filmed unless otherwise stated. Those filmed for Hawaii are indicated and everything filmed for Hawaii has been filmed for Australia. To be used in conjunction with List (in blue cover) of German Naval Files microfilmed in the Admiralty for Australia, 1959.

HISTORY

In November 1958 the Commonwealth National Library Liaison Officer in London learnt from the Admiralty that a number of captured German Naval Records relating to the Pacific were being microfilmed for the University of Hawaii, (Librarian Dr. Carl E. Stroven). After correspondence with the Commonwealth National Library and the Public Library of New South Wales it was decided to include these files in the Australian copying Project. The School of Pacific Studies at the Australian National University had also heard of the Hawaiian project and considered obtaining its own copies until it was decided that an inclusive series should be filmed for the Australian Copying Project.

Except for selected files to be retained at least temporarily by the Admiralty, the captured German Naval records are being returned to West Germany - some have already gone. During microfilming an assurance was received from the Admiralty that Australia would be given time to select and copy files required. In this connection, Australian Naval Officers at Australia House supported our request and were very helpful. It is understood that the records are to be stored at Koblenz and at Freiburg in Breisgau. The authority in charge will be:

Schedules of the records have been compiled by the British Admiralty with the assistance of a German Archivist employed there. Research on the records and microfilm of files for copying is under the direction of Commander Saunders, R.N., Historical Section, The Admiralty, Whitehall, S.W.1. The schedules examined for Australia were selected after discussion with Commander Saunders and his staff.

It is of interest to note that the whole of the captured German Naval records were filmed by the United States Navy. The films are available in the United States at Washington. However, American Universities and other interested persons have found it worth while to have their own microfilms made of selected files because of the huge bulk of the records, because of technical difficulties encountered by the United States Navy when the first filming was carried out and because special examination of relatively small sections is advisable.

1. The following description gives our reel number, the British Admiralty reference shelf number and the German Naval Archival reference number. (The British Admiralty number is the exact number not the shelf numbers 608-625 quoted in earlier reports.)
2. It was the German practice to duplicate documents in several locations wherever useful. Ship reports and consular reports for example, were usually made in triplicate. Concerning ship reports, it should be noted that the fullest copies are filed in 5180 to 5185, Admiralstab, Akt. B. Ostasiatische Station (1896-1914) and in 5186 to 5188, Australische Station (1900-1914). However, these station files do not cover the whole period included in the captured records and other files are therefore copied, i.e. PG/65001 to PG/65012, PG/65055 to PG/65072, Reichs-Marine-Amt, Entsendung von Kriegsschiffen etc.
3. After correspondence with Australia selected East Asian files were filmed in addition to those described above, chiefly because they supplement captured German Foreign Office files already filmed. The importance of Far Eastern history to Australia also influenced this decision.

ORDER OF FILES ON MICROFILMS

A chronological order was followed as closely as possible and some "East Asian" files therefore occupy the first reels of microfilm. Then follow files relating specifically to Australia and the South Sea Islands and then some files relating to China and Japan, covering the Boxer uprising and early naval development and foreign relations. These last were included because of their interest in the study of the history of the Far East and because they supplement captured German Foreign Office files relating to China and Japan, which had been included in our selection of German Foreign Office files. A few other files from captured naval records were filmed because they supplement captured German Foreign Office files we had filmed.

Finally files relating to the operations of raiders in the Indian Ocean and Pacific Ocean during the Second World War have been filmed. Reports from raiders were despatched as opportunity offered, often in three or four separate lots and duplicated. The reports are incomplete because some did not reach their destination. From the mass of files preserved the best set has been selected by officers of the Historical Section of the Admiralty.

In selecting files reference has been made to official German publications founded on the records and other published works. (List appended to this report). Files filmed are those containing reports giving political, economic, general, naval and military information, and especially secret files. All enclosures are filmed except photographs, maps and charts not suitable for microfilm photography.

DESCRIPTION.

- Hawaii and relate to early German expeditions to Japan and Chinese waters 1854-1867. They include documents relating to the Philippines, East Indies and New Guinea.
- II. Reels 7-13. See List (in blue cover) of German Naval Files Microfilmed in the Admiralty for Australia, 1959. These were filmed for the University of Hawaii and relate to German Naval vessels in the Far East 1867-1912 and in Australian and Pacific waters 1875-1913. Note that these files supplement, although they to some extent duplicate, reports filmed on reels 15-32. The fullest copies of documents from German stations in the Far East, Australian and Pacific were filed in Admiralstab der Marine, Abt. B. These were the Station files but do not cover the whole period included in the captured records. For this reason then, files from Reichs-Marine-Amt archives have been filmed.

Preliminary note on references to Polynesian labour in Peru.

I visited Rhodes House on July 27<sup>th</sup> and July 31<sup>st</sup> 1959, and completed a general examination of the above papers. I also searched the section of papers arranged by territory, Section G., and the Card Index to Places, in which letters in Section C. were written. I did not have time to search the Minute Books of the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society 1862 - 1870, (Section E.2.) It is possible that these may have some references to the subject. The only existing Minute Book of the Aborigines Protection Society is that of 1902 - 1909. Some proceedings were published, but I have not yet been able to check what proceedings were published in the 1850's and 1870's.

The results of searching Section G. of the Papers, and the card indices to Section C. and letters indexed is disappointing. As the place index to Section C. indexes only places from which letters were written it is possible that other letters about Polynesians in Peru may exist among the papers. If I could discover by whom these might be written, I might be able to find them from the card index to names, or alternatively it will be worth looking through the correspondence of the Secretary to the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society, 1862 - 1870, in the relevant volumes of C1 - 121, and correspondence of the Secretary of the Aborigines Protection Society for the relevant period in C122-153. Letters of relevant date in C154-160 and C161-167 may also be worth searching. (Cf. Note on the Papers p.2.)

Unfortunately, the letters now collected as Section C. of the Papers have been mounted and bound so that many letters bound near the spine cannot be placed flat enough for micro-filming. Where there is a margin on the original it should be possible to film. Section G. is unbound.

I did not find any reference to Polynesian labour in Peru when searching Section G. (Cf. Notes on Section G.), but the Card Index to Places, under Peru, led to letters from Gilbert Sandilands, Callao, and Edward Bernard March, Consul in Fiji 1870 - 1872. Sandilands' letter, May 24th 1875, (C146/110) reference to Polynesian labour in Peru ("some years ago"), and an allegation that E.B. March was keeping a Polynesian slave girl at Lima. (March seems to have been Consul there C.1874-1881). Other correspondence from March, and referring to him, seems to show that March had really "rescued" this girl and that he did a great deal to protect natives while he was in Fiji. (C159/54, C142/29-37, C85/10-12.)

British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society

Section G. Papers arranged by territories.

G1 - 494 is a collection of papers, 19th and 20th centuries to 1941, arranged according to the territory to which each group of papers refers, or, in a few cases, to the subject matter. No attempt is made to distinguish between the papers of the two Societies. There is no card index to names, places or subjects. It is difficult to understand why some of these papers are not placed with other correspondence in G and so indexed on cards by names of writers and places from which written.

Sorting of the papers is not completed, e.g. papers re Polynesian Labour in Queensland are found both in G 97 and G 101.

The following notes on sections of G which contain material of Australasian and Pacific interest are a brief outline only. A more detailed list is being made. A number of the papers seem worth microfilming but they include many printed items. A list of these is being prepared and will be available shortly from P. Mander Jones. -

Notes on Sections relating to Peru, Australasia and the Pacific Islands

Peru

G 82. South America, Peru 1874-1875

These papers contain no reference to the Peruvian slave trade in Polynesians 1862-4. There are papers relating to the treatment of Chinese coolies in Peru. The papers include letters from W.C. Mitchell, British Legation, Lima, Jan. 18 and Jan. 20, 1875 to Rev. B. Milland, 27 New Broad Street, London. The letter of January 18th is worth copying, 8 pp. 4to. 4 pp. re cruelties to Chinese coolies, all second-hand information, then 4 pp. about "South Sea Labour Traffic" (apparently not to Peru). Refers to an article in The Times under this title, dated 29th Oct. (1874). Criticises Consul Layard. Speaks of having been in Fiji and of his article on Fiji in the July no. of Fraser's Magazine 1874.

G 317-348. South America, Peru 1909-12

Cerro de Paseo Mining Co., Inambari Para Rubber Estates Ltd., Peruvia Amazon Co., Putomayo atrocities, etc.

Australasia

G 97-99 Australia and New Zealand, 1843-1890?

These include a few papers on Maconochie's plans and V.D.L. assignment system (c.1843); some letters on Polynesian recruiting written from Queensland 1869-1890's (Robert Short 1869, Alfred Davidson, 1869-1871, A.J. Vogan 1890's) also a questionnaire re kidnapping filled in by Rev. J. Jones, L.M.S. Loyalty Is. 1870; a number of papers about the Maori question 1860's - 1880's; a few papers about outrages against aborigines in Queensland 1874; and a few other papers about ill-treatment of aborigines in Western Australia 1866 to 1886.

G 374 - 383. G 374 - 9. Australian Aborigines 1926-1940.

The bulk of these files are in-letters and carbon copies of out-letters re Australian aborigines. A few letters in G 374 deal with natives in the New Hebrides. There are a number of printed items.

G 380-383 are nearly all printed items.

Pacific Islands

G 100 -101 Pacific Islands 1868 - C 1890. These include Fiji letters especially a letter from Consul E.L. Layard at Levuka, C.1874-5 and a copy of a letter to him from Lieut. Edward A. Liardet, 1874, (there are other letters from E.A. Liardet, 1876-1877); letters from John Kay, Sec. of the Reformed Church of Scotland Missionary Society about labour traffic and the New Hebrides Mission, 1871-3; New Guinea letters (F.P. Labilliere and W.G. Lawes); Queensland Polynesian Labour letters and letters re aborigines in Western Australia.

G 384-398. G 384-388. deal with Borneo (Mr. de la Mothe's papers and Mr. Bryett Turner's documents), 1903-1913; G 389-392 deal with Fiji and the Gilbert Islands, 1901-1913; G 393-4 deal with New Guinea, 1913-1937; G 395-397 deal with the New Hebrides 1909-1933; and G 398 deals with the land-laws amendment Act in New Zealand 1912.

British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society and

In 1961 the records of the Society from 1941 to 1951 will be added to the collection.

These papers are deposited at Rhodes House. A description has been prepared by the Library at Rhodes House and one or two copies are available for consultation with the papers or with the Indexes to the papers on cards. These copies are in spring-back quarto folders entitled on the cover: Anti-Slavery Papers - Indexes. The title page runs as follows:-

Papers of the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery and Aborigines Protection Society kept in Rhodes House Library, Oxford. Introduction pages 1-2; Guide to sections A - J pages 3-11; List pages 12-52. 1956.

The following is the substance of the contents of this description. It is intended that a microfilm of the description be obtained under the Australian Joint Copying Project.

### Introduction

The papers of the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery and Aborigines Protection Society up to 1941 were purchased from the Society by the Rhodes Trustees in 1951. The Society attained its present form in 1909 when the long discussed amalgamation took place between the two societies that form its name; but the collection of papers here listed contain the records of more than these two societies.

In 1823 a number of men, led by William Wilberforce and Sir Thomas Fowell Buxton, began to meet regularly in London to discuss the slave trade and slavery in British possessions. Calling themselves the "Committee on Slavery" they appointed the Quaker Samuel Hoare as their treasurer and Zachary Macaulay as the editor of their journal "The Anti-Slavery Reporter". There were a number of secretaries of this committee, that later changed its name to the "Society for the Amelioration and Gradual Abolition of Slavery"; the only two of interest in relation to these papers are Thomas Pringle (1827 March 13 to 1834 December) and Robert Stokes who succeeded him. The latter remained Secretary when, in 1835, this society became the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society. Letters to and from Thomas Pringle and Robert Stokes appear at the beginning of Section C of the Anti-Slavery Papers and the Minute Books of the Committee on Slavery are in Section E (see below.)

Robert Stokes was also Secretary to the Trustees of the Mico Charity who administered the funds left by Lady Mico in the seventeenth century for the education of negroes ... Through Stokes (papers connected with this fund) ... 1835-1842, became part of the Anti-Slavery Papers.

Some of the letters of the National Freedmen's Aid Society must have come into this collection in much the same way, since Thomas Phillips, who was secretary to the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society in 1870 and 1871, was also secretary of that Society at the same time, as successor to Aspinall Hampson, its first secretary ...

There are also in the Anti-Slavery Papers the records of the Committee for the Welfare of Africans in Europe which was formed during the first World War ...

The records of the Aborigines Protection Society are not completed. Many of their records seem to have been destroyed before the amalgamation took place, certainly all but one of their Minute books was destroyed at that time. However, in bulk the letters received by each of the two most important of the Society's secretaries far exceed those received by any one of the Anti-Slavery Society's secretaries.

The collection falls into nine main sections; each section is labelled not only with a letter A to J, and a number, giving its position within the collection, but also with a Shelf-mark, MSS Brit. Emp. S 16-24. An exhaustive index of the whole collection has not been considered necessary.

In 1961 the records of the Society from 1941 to 1951 will be added to the collection, and this addition will continue at intervals of ten years.

The main series of general nineteenth century correspondence has been arranged in volumes under the names of the officers of the societies receiving them. As more than one society's correspondence is in this section, an attempt has been made to distinguish between the letters received by each. There are four main divisions:

1. (C1-121). The first consists of correspondence of secretaries and assistant secretaries of the Committee on Slavery and the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society that developed from it, of the treasurers, presidents and chairmen, and other committee members of that society, together with the secretaries of the National Freedmen's Aid Society, who were also most active committee members of the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society. The names and dates of the societies' officers etc. in the order in which they appear in Section C are as follows:- (For this list see microfilm which will be made.)
2. (C 122-153). The second division consists of the correspondence of the secretaries and one treasurer of the Aborigines Protection Society until 1909. Since only one minute book of the society survives it has been impossible to give the exact dates of the officers' appointments. The three secretaries were Thomas Hodgkin, followed by F.W. Chesson until his death in 1888, and H.R. Fox Bourne who died in 1909. The treasurer was R.W. Fowler at one time Lord Mayor of London.
3. (C 154-160). The third division is formed by letters written to people who held no major office in any of the societies, those letters where the recipient is untraceable either by mode of address or by endorsements, and by anonymous fragments of letters ...
4. (C 161-167). The fourth division is of official letters from Prime Ministers, government officers, foreign legations, etc. to officers of the several societies ...

Section S ... is a collection of papers covering both the nineteenth and twentieth century to 1941 and arranged according to the territory to which each group of papers refers, or, in a few cases, to the subject matter. These papers have been sorted and each group or bundle of papers dealing with a specific place or subject has been placed in a sort file and numbered. The papers within each file have, as far as possible, been arranged in chronological order.

In addition to the list of these volumes, a card index of the letters is available. The cards are arranged according to the names of the writers. Each card bears also the names of the place or places from which the letters have been written, the name of the person to whom they were written, usually an officer of one of the societies, but if they were written to someone else and then came into the hands of an officer of a society, both their names are given, the outside dates of the letters are given, the number of the letters, the shelf-mark of the whole collection, MSS Brit. Emp. S 18, the number of the volume, e.g. C 1, and the serial number of the letters e.g. 85-93. This index is cross-referenced under the names of persons other than officers of the societies to whom the letters were sent, and also under place names. Thus it will be possible to trace the letters in this section from or to any particular person by consulting this index or, in the case of officers of the societies, the list for section C below. Readers interested in a particular place, e.g. Jamaica or Birmingham, should be able to trace letters from these places from the index and from the list of section G described below.

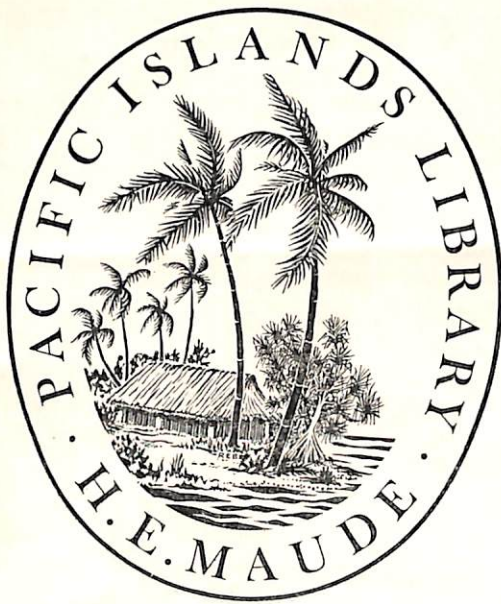
