### THE TEACHERS' CONFERENCE.

The second annual conference in connection with the Teachers' Union will be held next week. At 10 o'clock on Monday the delegates will meet for the transaction of preliminary business, and an hour later the proceedings of the session will be formally opened by his Excellency the Governor. Subsequently papers on "Economy of educational effort," contributed by Mr. Inspector Rix, of Victoria, and "Upright writing," by Mr. R. Rail, of Talbot, Victoria, will be read. Motions of which notice has been given will then be discussed, amongst them being one "That the arrangements for the teaching of sewing in our schools are incomplete, and should be placed on a better footing." In the evening the delegates will, at the invitation of the Superintendent of Fire Brigades, inspect the Metropolitan fire brigade-station. On Tuesday the election of officers will be conducted, after which discussions will take place on several set subjects previous to the resumption of debates on notices of motion. One motion set down for Tuesday is "That the compulsory attendance of scholars should be 40 days per quarter instead of 35," and another is, "This conference expresses its dissatisfaction at the present system of over-promotion." In the evening the delegates will pass an hour or two at the University as guests of the Vice-Chancellor and council. On Wednesday the adjourned meeting of the Teachers' Superannuation Fund will
