THE PLAY

It is not certain, but highly probable, that the author of our play, whose identity is concealed (probably deliberately) under the name of "Mr. S. Mr. of Art" on the title-page of the earliest edition, was John Bridges, afterwards Dean of Salisbury and Bishop of Oxford. The author of an abusive pamphlet published in 1588 definitely ascribed the play to him, mischievously reminding the Lord Bishop of Oxford of what he was no doubt anxious to forget—the work of plain John Bridges. The same author referred to the play as "this trifle, which sheweth the author to have had some witte and invention in him"—an admirable description of it. It is by no means a fair specimen of the popular drama of its day. Its popular success in later years was largely due to its broadness and boisterousness, its original and skilfully contrived plot; but in addition to these, its delightful blending of English rusticity and classical comedy, the idiom of yokels with the classically heightened tones fashionable in the drama of learned institutions, and the author's keen sense of the incongruity of the elements so blended—we may be sure that these were meant rather for the delectation of such audiences as the learned clerks of "Christes Colledge in Cambridge."
