## SYDNEY UNIVERSITY SCHEME.

MELBOURNE, November 11.  
The New South Wales Minister for Public Instruction (Mr. Carmichael) was in Melbourne to-day on private business. He returned to Sydney by the express train this afternoon. In the course of an interview, Mr. Carmichael said the University Bill, which he recently introduced into the New South Wales Legislative Assembly, was the greatest reform that had ever been attempted in Australia. It made access to the university easier than anywhere else in the Commonwealth. When the scheme was in full working order 800 students would be selected from the whole of the primary schools of the State.

A memorable event in the history of South Australian Congregationalism took place at the Semaphore last night, when the first student of Parkin College (Mr. A. C. Stevens) received ordination. Mr. Stevens, who has had a distinguished college and University career, is in his 23rd year, having been born at Aldgate on December 30, 1889. He is the third son of Mr. C. J. Stevens, journalist, now residing at Enfield, and was educated at Unley and Sturt-street public schools and Malvern, Muirden, and Kyre Colleges. While at Sturt-street he won a Muirden College scholarship and before he was 14 years of age he passed the University junior and the junior commercial examinations in 13 subjects. He then spent a few months on a farm and afterwards was engaged for three years in the office of the Adelaide Chemical Company, whose employment he left to prepare for the work of the ministry. From Kyre College in 1908 he matriculated, attaining fifth place in the general honors list for candidates over 18 years of age; and after a successful year at Keith as home missionary he entered Parkin College for divinity and the University for the B.A. honors philosophy degree, passing first class in psychology, logic, and ethics, and dividing with Miss Allen the Roby Fletcher prize for psychology and logic in 1910. Last year he was pastor of the Halifax-street Congregational Mission Church, and promoted the formation of the Theological Students' Inter-denominational Association of Adelaide, of which he was the first president; and this year he is vice-president of both the University Arts' Association and of the University Students' Christian Union. He has been appointed South Australian editor of an Australian social handbook now in course of preparation. On Sunday the new minister will be inducted as the first pastor of the Semaphore Congregational Church.
