RHODES SCHOLAR.

The 1912 Award.

Mr. E. Britten Jones Appointed.

The Rhodes Scholarship Selection Committee for South Australia announced on Monday, following upon a meeting held at Government House, and presided over by His Excellency the Governor, that Dr. Edmund Britten Jones, of the Adelaide Hospital staff, and an old scholar of Christian Brothers' College, had been appointed the Rhodes Scholar for 1912. There were five candidates, and the meeting lasted about three hours. Other members of the com-



mittee present besides the Chairman were His Honor the Chief Justice, Messrs. G. J. R. Murray, K.C., and J. R. Fowler, M.A., Professors Henderson and Chapman, and Mr. C. R. Hodge (secretary of the committee).

The successful candidate, who is a son of Mr. E. B. Jones (Government Valuator), has had a brilliant career. He was born on October 8, 1888, graduated in medicine at the University last year, and was shortly afterwards appointed a house surgeon at the Adelaide Hospital. In April and September he was acting medical superintendent of the institution.

Dr. Jones was educated at St. Dominic's Priory, North Adelaide, in 1896-8, and for a while at Xavier College, Melbourne. In 1899 he entered Christian Brothers' College, Adelaide, and the following is a list of the successes attained by him:—In 1903 he attained first place in the junior examination, and the highest pass in Greek, Latin, and mathematics. In the senior in 1904 he was placed twelfth. In 1905 he passed the higher public examination in five subjects, and was placed seventh on the list in South and Western Australia. In 1906 he entered on his course of medicine at the Adelaide University, and obtained a first-class pass at the end of the year. In 1908 and 1909 he repeated this feat, and in addition to defeating all students of those years won the Dr. Davies Thomas scholarship, both years. During his final year as a medical student he secured the Everard scholarship. Besides his success as a student, he has been equally prominent in the athletic field, and twice represented the University in the interstate sports. He is also well known in the football arena, having played for the North Adelaide League team last year, as well as for 'Varsity in important contests. In 1905 he won the Christian Brothers' College Cup for athletics. At University sports in 1906, 1907, and 1910 he was successful in a total of five handicaps. As a player of lawn tennis Dr. Jones was runner-up in the singles and doubles at the University tournament in 1908. He was South Australian singles champion for handball in 1907, and a doubles champion from 1906 to 1909 inclusive. In 1907 and 1909 he participated in interstate handball, and was a successful competitor in the latter year for the doubles championship. Dr. Jones took part in inter-University cricket in 1910. The 1912 Rhodes scholar has been frequently a member of various selection, general, and social committees in connection with the University. He was secretary of the Medical Students' Society in 1908, and last year one of the selection committee of the North Adelaide Football Club. He also became a committeeman of the Christian Brothers' Old Collegians' Association in 1910.
