THE ALEXANDER CLARK MEMORIAL.

From W. H. Leaney: - "Some little time ago the Alexander Clark Memorial Prize was competed for at the Conservatorium of Music; and, although the result has not yet been published, seeing that one of the conditions is that every candidate must have been a pupil at one of the State schools for a period of not less than two years, between the ages of 11 and 16, I would like to suggest to those responsible for its establishment that the winner's name of this and every succeeding year should be placed on an "honour tablet" in every State school of South Australia. This would serve a two-fold purpose. In the first place the memory of that gifted musician and the organizer of the thousand-voices concerts would be perpetuated day by day and for ever in the minds of those who have attended, are attending, and will attend the State schools of South Australia. Secondly, it would add a little of the atmosphere and spirit of emulation to the children of the State schools, which now seems so sadly lacking, but of which much has been made in the public school life of Old England, and the chades of which have fallen somewhat on the great private (public) schools of South Australia."
