When you grow up I hope you will read all about my poor natives who are dying out everywhere. The man who drew & painted these pictures is dead, & his people are also all dead, & his home-ground is now a town called Broomie where the pearls come from.

His name was Bill'ing'gi & his father's principal Totem (food) was the gajjalbae (porpoise). Their ~~own~~ Totems were principally food Totems. Totem is an American word. The Broomie name for Totem is jal'nga.
