My dear Frank,

Looking at our table on segmental functions, to which, as you know, I want to add an extension from one to two, it occurs to me that our page will take six columns without crowding, and that in using the table we have rather frequently been needing the functions cosh and sinh also. I am enclosing a slip to supplement page 69, and a new complete page for the extended table. The values have been checked, but the last two columns are simple sums of the columns on the left, not adjusted for any accumulation of last figure errors. This is actually more accurate for the purposes in view, which involve often dividing the segmental functions by the corresponding hyperbolic functions.

I have asked George Barnard to send you a short note I have written on table 11 of Pearson and Hartley's "Biometrika Tables", which seems to be so wildly wrong that attention should be called to it at once. I do not know where it should be published, but perhaps you will have some ideas on this.
