May I make a suggestion? Could you from this data write a paper showing the fallacies of other methods and the interpretation of this one? The trouble is that various people are working on the inheritance of milk yield from a statistical point of view and I am sure that not one of us has any knowledge or appreciation of the mathematical side of it. Nobody who has written on the inheritance of milk yield seems to have more than a practical knowledge of the question and even Gowen lacks that. A & Buchanan funt
