The mean square for B X O X W is the variance for error 0.2050, corresponding to a S.D. 0.45 in the units used for reduced deflexion. This as you say is high on the range of numbers scored. The last 4 items show no differences sufficiently great to be judged significant, though two of them suggestively bigger than begey (0.2050). The striking ~~mean~~^{second} count of word 88, may show the kind of thing that is happening.

All the first 3 are significantly greater than the last
4. This shows that the average variation to all words is very
^{great} difficult on different occasions, is this psychological or
mechanical ?

It will not be worth while working up the words only 3 or 2
