Thanks for your letter. I am very glad indeed to know what you are doing. The figures you send seem decidedly reassuring on the ^{normality of the lethal dose} ~~viability~~ of normal cats. I think the increase in variance of the lethal dose with increasing rate of injection is a sound reason for preferring the logarithm. I forget whether or not you know the series of papers published by C.I. Bliss over here in the Annals of Applied Biology. I believe one more bearing on time of survival is due to appear shortly. If you do not already know these I think you will find them exceedingly useful as he illustrated a variety of procedures in great detail.

It so happens that quite a number of my little girls have taken simultaneously to collect stamps, so there is great enthusiasm and a large demand. Your suggestion is, therefore, Very much a propos.
