Many thanks for your two letters. I am returning the carbon typescript of my draft note and agree entirely with your emendations, to which I have added a few more, apparently of mistypings. In your insertion at the foot of page 2 I should be inclined to end with ". Moreover, so long ", instead of ". But so long ", and have written this in as a reminder, but, of course, only to be accepted if you think it eases the reading. Also, if you see any way of dividing up some of the rather heavily qualified sentences which we have had to use, please do so without hesitation, or the delay of sending to me again. Perhaps, for example, my insertion on page 3 "of comparable or greater magnitude" ought to be in parentheses. But this is very much a matter of taste, differing from one reader to another.
