My dear Henry,

I am sorry I shall not catch you when I am over for the Junior Scientific Club on Monday 10th. May.

Your last letter has cleared up all the doubts and difficulties I sent you, but there is one that I should have noticed before and perhaps you have already explained the circumstances, but I want to be quite sure that I interpret the triangle correctly.

In Area I males there are two cases, August 28th. and 29th., in which butterflies are put down as captured on the day of release, one on the first and four on the second occasion. These are days on which, unlike other occasions, many more butterflies were captured than released. For example, 43 on August 28th. of which only 26 were released and 64 on 29th. of which 35 were released. Probably the anomalous entries have something to do with this, but I just forget what they mean.
