Thanks for your letter. I was glad to hear that you had come back.

I most certainly think that a sketch map of the locality should be included. I think you did show me one some time ago, perhaps of your own making.

I am letting Darlington know that you can send him the paper at once if, as I hope, it is in time for the first number. If not we shall have a month or two to consider embellishments.

I am so glad you enjoyed your stay in the States. I was sure you would like it and that you would find it, as I have constantly done, a really stimulating and encouraging experience. Also, of course, I have wanted your work to be appreciated over there by the many people capable of appreciating it.

I am venturing this year to put Race's name up for the Royal. I believe it is the right time now that his work with the Rhesus factor can be appreciated, and it is manifest that the real progress that has been made is his work in a very personal sense. If he gets in it will have to be by the support of geneticists, for I am fairly sure that immunologists and pathologists do not yet appreciate it. Darlington is certainly in favour, and I shall try Hindle, Salaman, Punnett and, I suppose, Haldane and Hogben.
