My dear Ren,

I am sending this off on Wednesday, which in normal times should reach you well before you leave Cambridge. Now with this ghastly "Victory Holiday" there may be much delay: indeed I understand there are to be no posts at all tomorrow.

I enclose the following:-

(1). The strips for the exhibits.

(with leave)  
The first is made up of 5 strips (a heading and three for the 4 rows of insects). The last of them is on a separate page. You will remember that it is decided that Cobias croceus should have a double space to allow room for specimens showing variation.

As arranged, the multipictorial exhibit occupies 3 whole columns (with 1 species in each) and 2 half columns. So there is one continuous

strip for the bottom of the drawer and one extra  
leading, to go half way down the last line.

In general, the names are the most-  
recent results of nomenclature, and the order is  
that now to be adopted. I omitted the English  
names as many of them take up such a lot of  
room (of course they are easily added if you  
want them).

I hope you will find this provides what  
you need.

(2). The dominate data with the sexes  
added. I also copied out this year's triangle  
as you may like to have it with the others, and  
enclose it also. Thank you so much for all  
your splendid help with this work.
