My dear Ford,

I am exceedingly sorry to have failed to attend the meeting on Thursday, especially as I was anxious to hear how your talks with the Ent. Soc. had gone on. I hope the business of the meeting was not in any way impeded by my absence.

I have written to Taylor giving such encouragement as I can on the work at the Radcliffe Infirmary, and will try to make an opportunity for meeting him in the near future. I do hope you will find cooperation from Cambridge all that could be desired.

I have been getting on with the paper I spoke of, winding up the first stages of the work with S^6 . With respect to your cooperation, I have tried to do as I would be done by, i.e., after referring in an introductory section to your Galton Lecture results with Abraxas, I have merely said, in describing the plan of our experiment here: "... an experimental plan was set up in collaboration with E.S.Ford of a somewhat novel kind." I hope this saddles you with no more and no less responsibility than you would like, although I might truly have said that from first to last the work was carried out in close consultation with you.
