My dear Fisher,

Thank you for your
most helpful letter, full of interesting
suggestions. It will certainly try to
get data on the nature of the Polish
comb in the way you suggest, now
that you have raised the point.

It may not have an
opportunity to do this at first, as our
accommodation and room is very
limited. Two of our pens will be
taken up at the start in obtaining
normal wattle and Polish chicks for
de Beer's embryological material, so that

only one or two crosses can be made
this year.

Naturally I am very

which you told me about in a
former letter. Are you likely to
be in London next Saturday (29th)
for the Genetical Society? If so,
and you have any time free in
