The Amer. Assocn of Physical Anthropologists recently met here at Harvard and Wiener gave a paper in which he advocated that there should only be one set of symbols (his) for the Rh, and he seemed to show that the Amer. Medical Assn. had been persuaded to back him in this regard. I thought you would be interested to know.

I am publishing in Holland a Monograph Volume on 40 years of Croonian research and in the Foreword I am making the statement that you were mainly responsible for reconciling the Mendelian and the biometric points of view. I hope this is agreeable to you as a true statement of the case.

I was very sorry to miss having a talk with you when you were here. My wife and I are expecting to be in England nearly a month - May 26 to June 20 - before sailing to Australia on a final anthropological expedition. I shall look forward to seeing you sometime during that period.
