I am sending under separate cover copies of the four papers on Dominance. You will notice that the theory has extended since it was first suggested, and now covers a great number of curious facts. The cotton case in the second paper was a great windfall, as was the relative invariability of the ^{dominant} homozygotes in Apotettix (4th. paper) which I inferred when away in Scotland, and could not verify for some months. Probably the most complete evidence is that from Lebistes, which is summarised and ought to have been much more fully expanded, in the 4th. paper.
