My dear Tosio,

Thank you for sending me, with your letter of April 8th, typescript of your paper, which I am honoured to see has been dedicated to me. As you may judge, I am very happy to see how far you have penetrated into my own thought so far as I have been able to express<sup>d</sup>, and I am sure that your exposition will be helpful to others of your countrymen, and indeed also to other nations, who so far have not always known what to think.

I hope to show you when we are in Stockholm, the note on ranks of uncertainty which I mentioned in my last letter, and which I shall be reading to the Biometric Society next week.

I should also like to mention that on reflection I have felt unsatisfied with one section of my new book, namely Chapter V Section 6 "Observations of two kinds", where the example I have chosen is unfortunate in that it fails to fulfil the essential condition of allowing of sufficient estimation. I have therefore written a new section to replace it in the second edition, material for which is already being asked for, and which I hope, therefore will not be very long delayed.
