I am now expecting to attend at the 30th Session of the International Statistical Institute at Stockholm, because I have been recently recommended as a perhap sole delegate from Japan by the National Committee for Statistics, although the final decision will be given at the General Meeting of the Science Council of Japan late in this month. If it will happen favourable as we expect, this means my first trip to Europe. I should like to take this opportunity to have the most benefitable days in Europe and also in England, if possible.

Do you remember our talks at Calcutta about the possible candidates from Japanese statisticians for the application of membership of the International Statistical Institute? After returning to Japan, I found that Dr. Motosaburo Masuyama has been already a condidate, but was unsuccessful last year.
