in the nature of a sotback, though personally I thought it exceedingly lucky that 8 should be identified so soon. Even if, however, it happened not to exist, I think that the clarification introduced into the subject by recognising these pairs of elementary antigens (which I have called C, d and 2) will not easily be nept noide.

Do you not think that with a little organisation it should prove feasible to interchange antibodies, packed perhaps in dry ice or a thermos flant for air transit ? The literature is somewhat bespattered with reported antibodies which have only been used in one laboratory, and I am sure the subject would be much advanced if the same individuals could be tested with a largish battery of appropriate Populants. It may, for example, be quite a maile before you in the States have a potent cample of '7 or perhaps before any of us have a good S ... Yet these would both be veluable in furthering research on the subject.
