Dear Dr Lewis,

I enclose an offprint which will be of more use than the very trifling one the Eugenics Society seem to have given you.

There is unfortunately no official registry of twins in this country, so that when they occur they are recorded as two independent births. The Royal Bounty does, however, provide a special registry of triplets comprising most of the triplet cases that occur.

Following the work reported in the offprint I took out the names and addresses of about five years more, with a view to circulating them some time to increase the relationship data which in my material was enough to be suggestive but not enough to be conclusive. I have never actually done this yet, and I should be quite prepared to draft with you a joint circular some time to include points of interest to you. I suppose I have about 300 cases waiting, but only a proportion will have two or more children still living.
