Dear Professor,

I enclose a draft of my dog report for your consideration. I do not have another copy. I have not used any symbols - if you think it desirable, we should go into the matter before deciding on the letters, perhaps. I have not discussed speckling and head spot as they are not so clear, at least in my mind, as the other genes.

I should like to come to the Galton Lab. on Thursday and see you about the self sterility problem we mentioned last week. If this afternoon (Thursday) is not convenient for you perhaps Miss Simpson could ring up the John Innes and leave a message to that effect. If I do not hear from you, I shall assume it to be alright and turn up in the early afternoon.

There are 450 plants of each of the three lots of *Lythrum* seed now growing here so there should be plenty for the summer. The Short and Mid ^{leafy} are also potted up ready for pollination work in the summer.
