Dear Peters,

Thanks for your letter of February 19th. I think it is clear from your table that in the presence of wetter, either (a) or (b), very small doses, I suppose about 3 and 6 gms per sheep, knock out Haemonchus very satisfactorily, though they are apparently without effect with water only. As a fact this seems extremely interesting, and one would like to know in physical terms what happened to the stuff. The non-significance of quantities compared with interaction is to be expected if quantity is inoperative for one mode of administration out of three, and of course says distinctly that one is not to ascribe the effect to, or recommend, the drug without regard to the mode of administration. This is no great drawback when mode of administration is under control, though it would be serious enough if the interaction were, let us say, with farms.
