Like all your mathematical work, I think your paper on "Discriminant Functions for genetic differentiation and selection" is certainly on the right lines from the mathematical standpoint and will certainly clarify the situation as it has been left by some earlier writers. I do not suppose that you meant by asking me this whether I thought you had given an exhaustive treatment from all the points of view which would be appropriate to a practical experimenter, so I will not attempt to discuss this larger question. I see, however, that you have made very good use of the Δ of the determinant ratio.
