My dear Riddell,

I got your note of March 25th. last night on my return from France. A good many changes have taken place in the location of prominent Americans, but I think it would be worth while visiting Cold Spring Harbor on Long Island, a Carnegie Institution centre, of which I believe Demerec is now director.

If Boyd would invite you to Boston, as he certainly ought, to give a lecture on ophthalmology and human genetics, you could probably see Diamond, who, I believe, is in Boston somewhere, and who is said, fide a Canadian correspondent, to have produced δ by immunisation. As δ is the only antibody now missing and a very vital one for all non-European populations, it would be valuable to know what has really been effected. Perhaps you saw the two Indian letters which followed Race's in last week's Nature. I am

sure the position will be obscure until 6 is available.

Then Snyder is at the Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio. He also could send you an invitation, which usually covers transportation costs and living costs for a weekend fairly adequately.
