Dear Taylor,

Many thanks for Boyd's collection, which I herewith return. I have revised the figures for Holland and Pelgium, using the whole of Boyd's material. Belgium is unchanged, but Holland is raised to perhaps a more reasonable figure. I enclose a slip of the actual calculations, so that you may be in no doubt of the origin of the figure quoted in our letter. Otherwise I have left the figures alone, although Wolff & Johason give a somewhat lower ratio for Sweden, though not enough to affect the argument. I have ordered 500 offprints. I do not think I have any chance of having Friedreich's data here.

. I am very glad you are now in touch with Low.

I see that Boyd gives a small group from Ireland with a Scotch-like ratio, which is not unexpected, but scarcely substantial enough to mention, so I have inserted the word "foreign" so as to read "the only foreign sample we know of".

As I suspected, your regrouping of Janet Vaughan's data increases the transference from B to AB from 3% to 6.87%, and

on recalculation would increase her apparent excess of AB's estimated from these regrouping data.
