You might like to see the data which Professor Cappell of Dundee has just sent in. If I understand him rightly, his reject group are only persons whom it has been decided not to bleed. Consequently, I believe the whole can be taken together as a sample comparable at least to what we get from other places.

You will notice that, like Glasgow and Aberdeen, there are over 10% B; but what is unusual in this batch is the low percentage of A as compared, for example, with O. In view of this low proportion the AB's show a slight excess in the women and are near expectation in the men.
