My dear Tedin,

I am glad to get your letter of June 13th, and have written to Oliver & Boyd about permission for reprinting extracts from the tables, such as you propose. I imagine they will make no difficulty, provided that reference is made on the pages on which the tables appear to the original source and, preferably, also to the larger collection of Statistical Tables by myself and Yates, which Oliver & Boyd have recently published. I suggest such a note as the following:

This table is condensed from the table of X2 (or z, or r and z, as the case may be) given in Fisher's Statistical Methods for Research Workers, 7th Edition, 1938. Oliver & Boyd, Edinburgh, and in Statistical Tables for Biological, Agricultural and Medical Research by Fisher and Yates, in which a more extensive collection of tables has been produced by the same publishers."

I am delighted that you will be able to attend the Edinburgh Congress. A large number of Congress visitors will be entertained in London August 15-17, and I shall certainly be about at that time, though probably we shall all be very busy. If the property you would like to discuss
