Dear Mr. Thomson,

I have discussed the matter of your table with Dr. Frank Yates, and on consideration do not think it would be fair to Sukhatme to replace his table by yours, nor of appreciable service to the reader to present both forms.

I think, however, something should be done to find a suitable medium of publication for your table, which, I presume, has been found of practical use in your work for the Ethyl Corporation. Of course, for this it should be accompanied with a note ^{in you} illustrating its uses and explaining the purpose of the change in relation to Sukhatme's form.

Suitable media for publication in this country are the Royal Statistical Society's Journals, B (Methodological) and Applied Statistics, the separate journal of the Industrial Application Section of the same society. There is also in this country Biometrika, edited by E. S. Pearson, and, of course, a number of journals specialized in the various sciences. For my own part I should be guided by wishing to publish in a journal used by potential users of the method. In your own country perhaps Eisenhardt of the National Bureau of Standards

or Norton at the Illinois Research Station would be glad to advise.
