Dear Professor,

I am writing to Haldane for the separatum which you ask for. In case you want his address in the future, he is now also at this College.

Yes, I should be very glad to have any old separata of yours on the problem of the sib method. I did not give any attempt at an historical analysis of the German literature, not so much because it is contentious, as because I am comparatively ill-acquainted with it and might have done someone or other an injustice, so I contented myself with a general reference to the whole controversy.

In working out the numerical example, I was really surprised that the effect of weighting the ascertainments was so great as it proved to be, in increasing the amount of information realised; actually by over 15%. There is something more to be got, but I think it cannot be much, by utilising the further information which I have neglected, from the lower lines of table VI.
