Inable for the set of preprints that you send with your letter of May 12th. I suppose at that time you had not seen the letters which appeared in Mature of May 5th, which had perhaps not yet reached the United States. I think you may now agree that there is ressen to think that more than one attibody reacts with the Rhessansepative cells and that these, so far as the data now go, confirm with the theory of three pairs of allelemorphic antigens which I had previously put forward.

I do not think I am justly exposed to the criticism of altering the notation capriciously, since I have used your symbols for the
6 ellelomorphs which you discovered independently of Race and Paylor,
and Race's symbols for R<sub>c</sub>, the seventh allelomorph which he added the .

year before last. The other symbols I have used are designed to
give the key to the mutual relationships of these allelomorphs and the
antibodies with which they react. I believe that key to the fact

boing found unothil. I can see no reason for introducing new symbols for Ry and R, once their relations with the others have be a recognised.

I particularly hope that quarrols as to notation among the rather few experts to whose labours the chacidation of this complex and important factor is due will not be allowed to discredit a very fine piece of medical and genetic research.
