of the Victoria Plains district
(Nyeerrgoo)

Yabararoo people Meenung to east of them. Ballarruk, Jirdajuk, Tondarup, Didarruk.

Weenkurt, m. Tondarup of Bajjee-bajjee, married
Nookootuyin, f. Ballarruk, of Beverley, and had issue
Dikkijan, f., Ballarruk
Monop, m. "

(Weenkurt was a dwerda borungur and the children follow the father's borungur.)

(Men borungur belonging to Beverley are all dead.

Yongar borungur Williams River way, some still living.)

Monop, m. Ballarruk, married Ngungilyan, f. A Tondarup. No issue.

Winijguttuk = to give a daughter if you had one, the mother of the daughter is so called. She must not speak to her son-in-law or go in his shadow. Thosa is the Nor' West name.

Weerdendee toordaroo = travelling dance, that is passing from men to men.

Woordoo, single man coming out from the rest of the corroborse crowd, and dancing by himself to music supplied by one person.

Monop saw a woman with four breasts, on the way between Wundham and Cooyapooya, about 100 miles inland from Wyndham. A white man was with him but Monop cannot recall the name.

Beerdawong is dennagur in the Southwest.

Monop was beerdawong, he was sent to Northampton where he stayed with the oldest man (babbin) there. Darrgoomurr - ngooljarmat (babbin) took him to Wilbin and them he was taken to Wilgan mya (Berkshire Valley) then on and on by easy stages. He stayed at Northampton for some months and then returned by the same stages and had two scars made and his nose pierced on the way. "Stranger" babbih must pierce his nose. When he returned he was carried on the shoulders of babbingur, 4 boys are carried in advance of him, each carried on the babbin's shoulder, but they are not beerdawong;

camp, if he had brothers, they knelt down leap frog style, and the boy rolled over their backs, then rolled off them on to his father's lap and then on to his mother's, and then he jumped up and ran away some distance, but shortly came back and an evening corroboree finished it. He didn't get married until his whiskers grew, which was some time after being made beerdawong.

When Yabaroo men paint themselves green (a kind of clay) they are on a mission of vengeance after a murderer, and they travel with their shields held before them about 30 or 40.

brothers cannot play with brothers nor with sisters, but with their sisters-in-law.

Goona burt = expression used for brothers in mourning.

Real cousins - brothers and sisters children - cannot marry, because the brother and sister are blood relations = demmangur. Close blood relations can never marry.

Jirdajuk is Victoria Plains name for Nagarnook.

Banaka and Kymera are ngunning to each other.
