I shall send a full copy of all the Folios to John Murray (Publishers) for future publication perhaps, but when I get back to my camp life again, I am going to write about the 'spirit-babies' – a lovely little idyll of the northern groups (W.A.). I must have the true bush atmosphere for this task.
